What's been happening at York Central?

Since our appointment as strategic development partners earlier in the year, we have been busy working on the complex jigsaw of elements that bring a project of this scale to fruition.

Already, the joint venture is generating positive momentum by working closely with a wide range of stakeholders, suppliers, potential occupiers and other partners to co-develop plans and opportunities for the benefit of York Central and the communities it will serve.

Not only are we actively engaging with all tiers of government, including the new combined authority and Mayoral office, the City of York Council and its leadership team, as well as the Government Property Agency, we have also established a regular senior stakeholder forum. This will help deepen these relationships and ensure York Central blends seamlessly into the city's, and wider region's, long-term socio-economic objectives. With outline planning consent secured for phase one of York Central, we are now working with our partners and stakeholders on the detailed design for what will comprise a significant proportion of the development. This includes the first commercial building, a new square, a new western station entrance as well as homes and a new urban park.

We look forward to meeting as many of you as possible at the public events being organised by City of York Holgate Ward Councillors in October, find out more on page 4 and 5.

New Government Hub given green light

A planning application for a state-ofthe-art government office development at York Central was given the go-ahead in July.

Following extensive public consultation, the application to construct a six-storey, 195,000 sq ft government hub was put forward by the Government Property Agency (GPA), Homes England and Network Rail, as the first major commercial building within the York Central development.

Development proposals, approved by the City of York Council Planning Committee, include 135,000 sq ft of flexible office space, with ground floor retail and ancillary space. Building features include solar panels, air source heat pumps and a green roof, as well as 230 cycle spaces and a planted pedestrian area. Initially earmarked for completion in 2027/2028, the hub will be home to up to 2,600 civil servants.

Welcoming the new Mayor

As part of his first 100 days in post, we welcomed the first Mayor of York and North Yorkshire, David Skaith and Leader of City of York Council, Cllr Claire Douglas for a visit in July.

Following a Q&A with York Central Partnership representatives, a site tour demonstrated progress to date and helped the delegation grasp the immense potential of this 45-hectare



regeneration project site, which will bring a vibrant new dimension to our historic city.

Sharing his visit on LinkedIn, David Skaith, said: "The project is not just huge in size, but also in the scale of opportunity for York and North Yorkshire residents. It's early days, but when the site reaches its potential of almost 6,500 new jobs, and with such excellent rail connectivity, it will open up employment opportunities for people across our region."

Proudly supporting new York Community Fund

We are proud to announce that at least £150,000 will be available for the newly established York Community Fund, thanks to initial investments from the Joseph Rowntree Foundation (JRF) and York Central Ltd.

The fund is a partnership between Two Ridings Community Foundation, City of York Council, York CVS, JRF and York Together. The official launch was held in August at the historic Merchant Adventurers' Hall, bringing together leaders from York's corporate, public and charitable sectors.

The event highlighted the critical support that local groups provide in creating thriving and connected communities. The York Community Fund aims to support local projects covering: Equality, Human Rights, Affordability, Climate Action, Health and Wellbeing.

Explaining why York Central Ltd has chosen to be the first commercial investor in the fund, Allan Cook said: "We truly believe that York Central will be a place for everyone to enjoy. Giving back to the community groups in the city that make life better for local people is very much part of our ethos. It will ensure people have the best opportunity to thrive in the places where they live and work."
